RE: AB 261 (Quirk-Silva) Fire safety: fire hazard severity zones: State Fire Marshal – SPONSOR/SUPPORT

Dear Chair Bryan:

I am writing on behalf of the California Building Industry Association, the sponsor of AB 261, and a broad coalition of organizations in support. This good government measure would strengthen the development of California's Fire Hazard Severity Zones (FHSZ) maps by authorizing the State Fire Marshal to confer with individuals and entities, including public agencies, nonprofits, and tribes, regarding actions affecting fire hazard severity zones between official reviews.

FHSZ map revisions occur intermittently, and this infrequency limits the ability for stakeholders to inform the Fire Marshal about mitigation actions that may impact and improve the degree of fire hazard within an area. Perhaps more importantly, AB 261 establishes a process to seek the advice of the Fire Marshal on measures these individuals or entities may implement to reduce the degree of fire hazard within an area. AB 261 offers a proactive solution by allowing a thoughtful dialogue between entities and the State Fire Marshal before the next state review. To ensure transparency, the correspondence and documentation exchanged between the State Fire Marshal and other entities would be made available on the State Fire Marshal's website for public access. A fee may be charged to entities that engage with the State Fire Marshal regarding their fire hazard severity zone assessments to offset associated costs of the implementation of the bill.

AB 261 improves the development of FHSZ maps by increasing public participation in the process and by allowing the State Fire Marshal to engage in an information exchange between cycles. FHSZ maps impact millions of Californians, as they influence the availability and affordability of insurance, the information provided to property owners of the relative hazard they may face, and the cost of housing. AB 261 will support informed decision-making, encourage fire prevention efforts, and ultimately strengthen community resilience across California.

For the reasons outlined above, our coalition is pleased to support AB 261.


